Dear Dr LeVeen,

The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education's (ACGME's) program requirements for residency education in the subspecialties of diagnostic radiology requires a letter of agreement between a program and each participating site that provides a required assignment. This letter serves as the program letter of agreement between the Vascular and Interventional Radiology Fellowship Program, a subspecialty program of the Diagnostic Radiology Residency Program with the College of Medicine at the University of Florida, and the Malcom Randall Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC). This agreement is effective from November 18, 2008, and will remain in effect for five years, or until updated, changed, or terminated by the Vascular and Interventional Radiology Fellowship Program and the University of Florida College of Medicine.

As the designated site director for the VAMC, you are responsible for the daily supervision, education, and evaluation of residents during their VAMC rotations. Your combined faculty also agree, under your direction and authority, to assume this responsibility. This includes providing appropriate supervision of residents in patient care activities and maintaining a learning environment conducive to educating the residents in the ACGME competency areas. The faculty must evaluate resident performance in a timely manner during each rotation or similar educational assignment and document this evaluation at completion of the assignment.

The content of the educational experiences has been developed according to ACGME program requirements and includes general rotation requirements and competency-based goals and objectives. In cooperation with me, as the overall program director, you and the associated VAMC faculty are responsible for the day-to-day activities of the residents to ensure that the general rotation requirements and competency-based goals and objectives are met during the course of the educational experiences at the VAMC.

Each resident is assigned to the VA twice throughout their one-year fellowship. Each assignment is one month in duration. During assignments at the VAMC, residents will be under the general direction of the policies and procedures outlined in the resident manual under the general direction of the Vascular and Interventional Radiology Fellowship Program and the University of Florida's Office of Graduate Medical Education.


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


